



## **RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE PRESENCE OF DOGS AT THE MANGGHA MUSEUM**

1. These Rules and Regulations govern the admission and presence of dogs on the premises of the Manggha Museum of Japanese Art and Technology (hereinafter: the Museum).
2. The Museum allows the presence of dogs in the common areas, i.e. the Entrance Hall, the Terrace extension of the Entrance Hall, and the Terrace outside the Europe–Far East Gallery building.
3. The owner or person in charge of the dog is fully responsible and liable for the behaviour of their dog when brought onto the Museum premises and is required to take all cautionary measures required to ensure the protection of the health and life of the people and other animals present on the premises, including but not limited to the requirement to make sure that their animal is as little of a nuisance to the others as possible and does not soil the areas intended for common use.
4. The owner or person in charge of the dog is required to maintain constant and effective supervision and control over their animal.
5. Aggressive or dangerous dogs must not be brought onto the Museum premises.
6. Dogs may be brought onto the Museum premises by adults only. This shall not apply to guide dogs accompanying blind people and assistance dogs accompanying disabled people.
7. When brought onto the premises, dogs must be on a leash or harness and wear a muzzle at all times.
8. Dogs are not allowed in the Exhibition Rooms or in the Multifunctional Auditorium. This shall not apply to guide dogs accompanying blind people and assistance dogs accompanying disabled people.
9. A dog must never be left unattended on the Museum premises.
10. The owner or person in charge of the dog is required to remove any faeces left by their dog.
